D.A. promises crackdown on graffiti, with 10 to 30 days in county jail for adult offenders

The Willacy County and District Attorney's Office announced today that it is taking a firm stance against graffiti related vandalism. Graffiti costs the cities and county thousands of dollars a year, damages property, lowers property values, and promotes a general perception of lawlessness that can lead to a flourishing of crimes. Working together with law enforcement, the District Attorney's Office is devoting its resources to combating this pervasive blight by instituting a new standardized sentencing policy requiring stiffer penalties for adult and juvenile graffiti offenders.

Under the new adult graffiti policy, all first time offenders will be given the maximum probation term of 2 years for misdemeanors and 5 years for state jail felonies. Moreover, as a condition of probation the state will require confinement of 10 days in county jail for misdemeanors and 30 days for felonies. The offender will be required to pay a fine of \$1,000 for misdemeanors and \$3,000 for felonies. The policy will also require the offender to pay full restitution reimbursing the owner of the property or political subdivision for the cost of restoring the property vandalized. The offender will also be given community service of 100 hours for misdemeanors and

300 hours for felonies. Similar changes will be made on juvenile graffiti cases. Upon a subsequent offense, the District Attorney's

Office will only offer the maximum jail sentence allowed by law. The new graffiti policy by the District Attorney's Office will

make it tougher on graffiti offenders and is also a warning to parents, who try to make excuses and plead for leniency.
